Article 101 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU), together with its equivalents under the national laws of the EU Members States, is the key EU competition law provision in this context. Broadly, it prohibits agreements which, by object or effect, restrict, distort or prevent competition (Article 101 (1) TFEU).
